

DEPT 14 – PLANT & SOIL SCIENCE

Class A – Field Crops

Premiums: Blue (2.00) Red (1.75) White (1.50) Pink (1.25)

Rules:

1. Exhibitors must be in grade 3 or older, enrolled in Field Crop Project (Corn, Forage, Small Grains, or Soybeans) and may show 5 exhibits.
2. Each exhibit must be cleaned/groomed and include the variety name, date planted, and date harvested.
3. Exhibits of dried field crops harvested from the previous year need to be exhibited by members enrolled in that project for 2 consecutive years.
4. Exhibits may be a poster (no larger than 14x22), display, report, etc.
5. **Examples of Corn Exhibits:** 3 corn stalks (roots not necessary), 6 ears of corn husked, shelled corn in quart sized jar (open only to 2nd year corn project members), high moisture corn (open only to 2nd year corn project members).
6. **Examples of Forage Exhibits:** Alfalfa or mixture 1 slice in plastic bag, Alfalfa or mixture sheath tied at top/bottom, Haylage/Oatlage in gallon size plastic bag.
7. **Examples of Small Grain Exhibits:** Dried 1 quart jar (open only to 2nd year small grain project members), sheath tied in 3 places (tied neck should be 3" in diameter).
8. **Examples of Soybean Exhibits:** Dried 1 quart jar (open only to 2nd year small grain project members), sheath tied in 3 places (tied neck should be 3" in diameter).

Reserve Grand Champion Field Crop & Grand Champion Field Crop – Rosettes

Class B – Vegetables

Premiums: Blue (1.75) Red (1.50) White (1.25) Pink (1.00)

Rules:

1. Exhibitors in Grades 3 – 6 may bring 6 best vegetable exhibits with no 2 of the same variety (Gold Pak carrots and Thumbelina carrots are different varieties of carrots).
2. Exhibitors in Grades 7 and over may bring 10 best vegetable exhibits with no 2 of the same variety.
3. **Exhibitor must name the variety on each entry tag** (example: Detroit Red beets or Gold Pak carrots).
4. Garden exhibits must be from your garden and presented on a 10" white paper plate.
5. Refer to project information 'Exhibiting & Judging Vegetables' by H.C. Harrison for preparing your exhibit.
6. Bring the number of specimens according to size of vegetable (small such as peas/beans = 6, green onions = 6, medium such as beets/peppers/onions/cucumbers = 3; large such as cabbage/broccoli/squash = 1)

Premiums: Blue (1.75) Red (1.50) White (1.25) Pink (1.00)

Rules:

1. Exhibitors must be enrolled in Herb Project.
2. Write the **name of herb** on entry tag.
3. Three cut stems, fresh or dried, no roots.
4. Fresh Herbs – Exhibit in a container of water, with leaves above water line.
5. Dried Herbs – Exhibit on a paper plate.

Class D – Fruit

Premiums: Blue (2.00) Red (1.75) White (1.50) Pink (1.25)

Rules:

1. Exhibitors must be enrolled in Fruit Project.
2. Fruits must be selected and prepared for exhibit by member.
3. Apples = 3 specimen, Grapes = 3 bunches, Blueberries/Raspberries = at least a 1/2 pint
4. Use same guidelines as for vegetables.
