

# DEPT 15 – FLOWERS, HOUSEPLANTS & LANDSCAPE

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## Class A – Fresh or Dried Cut Flowers

Premiums: Blue (1.75) Red (1.50) White (1.25) Pink (1.00)

### Rules:

1. Exhibitor may bring 10 best flowers from exhibitor's garden. Exhibits must be named (name of variety & type – annual, perennial, bulb, corm, or rose).
2. All entries must have foliage attached except for gladiolus, pansies, nasturtiums, calla lilies or coreopsis.
3. All exhibits should be staged in clear glass bottles or vase with narrow necks of appropriate size (no advertising). Dept supervisors are not responsible for breakage of bottle or vase.
4. Blooms that are 3 inches or less should exhibit 3 identical blooms. Blooms formed in sprays or clusters should exhibit 1 spray. Blooms that are 3 inches or longer or flowers grown on spikes, talks, or large steps & Hybrid Tea Rose should exhibit 1 Coleus, Hostas, or everlasting or dried flowers can exhibit 3 stems or sprays. Ornamental grasses can exhibit 1 small cluster.
5. No 2 entries of the same variety are allowed (example: variety = Red Sun Zinnias – Zinnias of a different variety are acceptable).
6. Failure to follow above rules will result in a lower ribbon.

1. Exhibitor may bring 3 arrangements. Creativity (unique & unusual) will be considered when judged. Please name the activity where arrangement would be used.
2. Fresh and/or dried materials may be used. No artificial materials or plants on the Wisconsin endangered species list may be used.
3. Line Design – Refer to 4-H Floriculture curriculum Level C.

### Rules:

1. Exhibitor may bring 3 exhibits and must be planted and maintained by exhibitor. Exhibits must be named.
2. If exhibit is a water garden or too large to bring to the judge, a booklet is acceptable for conference judging. The booklet should have pictures of the exhibit, how you cared for your exhibit, where it is located, etc.

**Class D – Houseplants**

Premiums: Blue (2.00) Red (1.75) White (1.50) Pink (1.25)

**Rules:**

1. Exhibitors in Grades 3-6 may bring 6 plants and Grades 7-13 may bring 8 plants.
2. Exhibit must be named (Botanical name is a plus) and if multiple plants all plants must be named.
3. Exhibits may be grown in water or dirt and must be cleaned with water only. Exhibit may be multiple cuttings of the same variety to make a fuller pot.
4. If purchased plant exhibit should be in your possession for 3 months so you know how to care for it.

**Class F – Garden Fun / Plant Crafts**

Premiums: Blue (3.50) Red (3.00) White (2.50) Pink (2.00)

**Rules:**

1. Open to youth enrolled in the Vegetable Garden project or Plant Crafts project.
2. Exhibit will be judged on information and completeness and unique creativity.
3. All materials to be collected & dried by exhibitor. No silk or plastic flowers allowed.
4. Examples of exhibits: Vegetable arrangement (may use any vegetable or parts of vegetables grown in garden), vegetable character (using parts of vegetables for facial features), Seed craft (using seeds to create a picture); 6 different vegetables for their nutritional value (Exhibitor furnishes a box which becomes part of the exhibit. Include a card telling why you chose these six and what they provide in our daily diet. If you use leafy vegetables such as lettuce or spinach that wilt easily, they may be placed in a container of water to keep them fresh.); Largest Veggie; pressed flower picture or bookmark; wreath; wall decorations; etc.
