




A Message from our Fair Board President

PRE-FAIR

ANIMAL ID, YQCA, & CHECK IN

All animal species are required to fill out the Animal ID & Check In Form. One Form is required per Species of Animal per Exhibitor. Form must be turned in to species Superintendent at check in. Bring your YQCA completion certificate with a date prior to 7/1/25. Only youth participating in horse, dairy, poultry, exotics, goats, beef, sheep, and swine need to complete YQCA. YQCA was due July 1st. The Animal ID & Check in Form can be found [here](#).

ANIMAL ID & CHECK IN FORM

Important: One Animal ID and Check in Form is required per Species of Animal per Exhibitor. Form must be turned in to species Superintendent at check in. Form to filed at the Fair Office.

All animal species exhibitors are required to fill out this form. Beef, Dairy, Sheep, Goats, Equine, Alpacas, Llamas, Poultry and Waterfowl, Cats, Dogs, Rabbits, and other small animals.

Additional species specific requirements:

Horse: Documentation for Negative EIA (coggins) with clear identification of animal, with description and photo.

Swine: Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (entire herd), (CVI or health certificate), PRRS & PEDv if applicable.

Poultry: Negative pullorum-typhoid origin, W1 tested for Associate flock or individual test document, wing or leg band ID

Dogs: Proof of current Rabies vaccination.

FAIR ENTRIES

ENTRY TAG PICK UP

Fair Office (Building 1) on July 13th or July 17th

- Entry tags will be available for pick up on Saturday, July 13th from 10:00 AM to 3:00 PM or on Wednesday, July 17th from 11:00 AM to 7:30 PM at the fair office in building 1.
- There are no tags for Dairy, Beef, Swine, Sheep, Goats, Horses and Dogs. Foods Revue, Cake Decorating, Clothing Revue and Shooting Sports tags will be available at the appropriate judging events.
- Attach the tags to your projects before going to the judge.
- Tear off your Claim Check from the bottom of the tag and fold the tag over your name. Save your Claim Checks! You will need them to pick up your projects on Sunday, July 21.



FAIR ENTRY CHANGES

Entries for the 2024 St. Croix County Fair have closed and no changes can be made unless it has to do with an animal illness. If you have an animal issue please contact the species department head for instructions on changing that entry.

JUDGING AT THE FAIR

Judging times and locations for specific departments are listed below and in the Premium Book.

Please expect some delays later in the day for Face to Face judging on Saturday, July 13 and Wednesday, July 17. Plan your time so that you can get all your exhibits judged. If you are in line and it is getting close to the end of the judging time, let someone know that you have other exhibits to judge so we can make adjustments.



TYPES OF JUDGING

Face to Face Judging (Formally known as Conference Judging)

Face to face judging of certain fair projects is performed to help exhibitors learn the strengths and weaknesses of their project directly from the judge. They meet face-to-face with the judge, who learns more about the work the exhibitor put into the entry while the judge evaluates it.

Exhibitors then receive a ribbon for the quality of the exhibit & knowledge of their project, as well as new information they can use for improvements for next year.

Danish Judging

The Danish system of judging provides more exhibitors a chance to receive a ribbon for their entries. Instead of placing only the best four exhibits and giving them a blue, red, white, or pink ribbon (like in Open Class) all entries are placed. All entries receive a premium and ribbon. The number of blue, red, white, and pink ribbons a judge hands out depends on the number of entries in the class. For example, if there are 8 entries in a class, up to 2 can receive a blue rating, up to 4 red ratings, up to 6 white ratings, and up to 8 pink ratings.

NON ANIMAL JUDGING AT THE FAIR



1. GET YOUR EXHIBITS JUDGED

After obtaining your entry tags from the fair office, take your tagged exhibit to the designated area to get judged. Stand in the appropriate line and wait for your turn. When its your turn, you can get all of your projects in that department judged at the same time (you don't have to get back in line for each exhibit).

2. TALK TO THE JUDGE

When talking to the judge introduce yourself (name, grade, and what club your in). Talk about your project. When the judge asks you a question about your project answer honestly. Please ask questions of the judge if you are not understanding.

3. RECEIVE FEEDBACK

If you've done your best work on your project, it's disappointing not to get the rating you were expecting. Just remember - the judge's opinion is simply one person's opinion. A different judge might have given you a different placing. But even if you don't agree with the judge, its worth paying attention to what he or she has to say about your project. You could get some great ideas for improvement.

Here are some tips about feedback:

- Pay attention to what the judge liked instead of getting upset about what he or she didn't like. Even if there were some negative comments, there were probably just as many positive ones!
- Don't be nervous about face-to-face judging. The judge is truly interested in youth, otherwise he or she wouldn't be there. Relax so you can be your friendly, natural self when the judge meets with you. And if you don't understand something he or she says, be sure to say so.
- Think about how you can use the judge's feedback. What can you do differently if you intend to keep working on this kind of project? What will you want to do the same way?

4. SCAN EXHIBITS

There are three locations where you can find a scanner station (Youth Exhibits Building #1, Croix Court Tent, and Youth Exhibits Building #9). Once your items are judged take them to the scanner stations to get scanned and receive your ribbons.

5. DISPLAY EXHIBITS

Once your items are scanned and ribbons are attached take them to their designated display area. Please ask for assistance if you are unclear where to take your items.

There is NO early release of exhibits. All exhibits, animals, and decorations must stay in place until 4:00 on Sunday, July 21.

PICKING UP EXHIBITS

SUNDAY, JULY 21 AFTER 4:00 PM

You can pick up your exhibits on Sunday, July 21 from 4:00 PM to 7:00 PM. You **MUST** bring your claim ticket with you when picking up any exhibits. Check out at the scanning station in each building.

If you can't make the Sunday time, you may pick up exhibits on Monday, July 22 from 9:00 AM to 11:00 AM. All large and fragile exhibits must be claimed. If exhibits are not picked up they will be thrown away. If you have a conflict, find someone who will pick up your exhibits with your claim tickets.

There is NO early release of exhibits. All exhibits, animals, and decorations must stay in place until 4:00 on Sunday, July 23.

PREMIUM CHECKS

Premium checks will be given to your 4-H club leaders in the fall (typically October). Please cash them as soon as possible. They expire within 90 days. After December 31, 2024 you will need to request a new check at fair board meeting.

1) Only a parent or legal guardian may register a child in the Mutton Bustin' Event, and sign a release form and waiver.

2) Children must be 5 years old, and may not exceed 55 lbs. This weight limit may change based on the size of the stock we have for the event.

3) Contestants must wear long pants, boots or sturdy shoes (no flip flops or sandals). Long sleeved shirts are recommended.

4) Children are encouraged to bring a bicycle helmet or they will be fitted for one on hand and it **MUST** be worn during ride. **NO EXCEPTIONS.**

5) Event happens rain or shine

6) Rules are subject to change without prior notice.

There is no entry fee and no prizes awarded. It is all for fun!


