

ATCP 160.10 – NOT OPEN TO YOUTH EXHIBITING IN THE JUNIOR FAIR

- 1. Completed entry forms are due May 31. Entry can be completed online at www.stcroixcofair.com or by mailing entry forms to *Cindy Van Dyk 904 131st Ave, New Richmond, WI 54017*
- Open Class exhibitor tags may be picked up on Saturday prior to the fair at the fair office from 10AM 3PM or on Wednesday of the fair from 11AM – 7:30PM and must be in place by 8PM Non-animal exhibits must be brought in on Wednesday Only. Animal exhibits may only be brought in on Thursday from 11AM – 7:30PM Animal exhibits must be in place by 8PM
- 3. All Open Class Fair Exhibits must be raised, grown or made by the exhibitor. All open class exhibits must be work done within the last 2 years or it will be disqualified. All animals and livestock must be shown by the exhibitor unless special permission is granted by the superintendent during judging.
- 4. No changes in entries are permitted. In the event an article has been entered in the wrong category, the item will be disqualified, but may be exhibited the following year.
- 5. All buildings will be closed to the public between 10PM and 9AM
- 6. Each exhibitor of animals must clean their own exhibit area. Exhibitors must bring their cleaning supplies forks, shovels, and wheelbarrows, and dispose of manure as directed.
- 7. Exhibits will be released from the buildings from 4 7PM on Sunday and from 8 11AM on Monday. Any removal of exhibits before 4 p.m. on Sunday will result in loss of premium money. Exhibitors are responsible for arranging to bring and take home their exhibits. Any exhibit remaining after 11AM will be disposed of at the discretion of the Fair Board.
- 8. In event of an emergency, refer to EVACUATION PROCEDURE map on the inside of the back cover of book to evacuate the fairgrounds.
- 9. Cleaning Barns after Fair All Open Class Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning their barn areas after the County Fair. All manure is to be dumped into manure pits near the end of the barns. St. Croix County Fair, Inc. requests that barn cleaning be completed by Monday, 8 p.m. If an exhibitor doesn't comply, they will be assessed a \$100.00 clean-up charge to be paid to the St. Croix County Fair, Inc. as well as a premium loss to the exhibitor.
- 10. No penalty for items entered but not exhibited.
- 11. All items will be exhibited at exhibitor's own risk.
- 12. All ribbons are awarded at the discretion of the judges and the decision of the judges is final in all cases.
- 13. Only one entry per exhibitor under each lot number.
- 14. The Superintendent of the Department and/or the judge has the authority to disqualify an item if it does not meet the class or the lot requirements or guidelines.
- 15. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to ensure that entry tags are attached to the items on entry day.
- 16. Exhibits and/or animals may not have been exhibited in open class division previously in a state aid funded fair in that calendar year and resulted in a premium being awarded for that item or animal.
- 17. Open Class exhibitors must reside in the following counties in Wisconsin: St. Croix, Dunn, Pierce, or Polk county.

Health Requirements

General Rules

- 1. Exhibitor must be present to bring rabbit to judge.
- 2. Maximum of 3 entries. Exhibitors may not enter the same rabbit in more than 1 class. Entries consist of 1 rabbit.
- 3. Each exhibitor is responsible for feed, water and feed containers. Shavings are provided.
- 4. All entries must be made in the name of the actual owner, and exhibit must be raised by exhibitor.
- 5. No premiums will be paid on disqualified exhibits or exhibits lacking in merit.
- 6. Regular judging will be used throughout the Open Class Division (1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th).
- 7. The Fair will exercise all reasonable vigilance in the care of exhibits and police arrangements of the building, but all specimens must be entered at the risk of the owner.
- 8. All exhibits are required to check-in at the Poultry building on Thursday of the fair week from 11 a.m. 7:30 p.m. so lot numbers can be checked against pre-registration and all rabbits checked for health. Please see page 125 for Animal ID and Check-in Forms. This form is required for ALL animals at the St. Croix County Fair.
- 9. All rabbits are released for pickup at 4 p.m. on the last day of the fair and must be picked up by 7 p.m. on that day. Rabbits may not remain past that deadline as the cages will be taken down.
